For one thing, I'm pretty good at being a trial lawyer. When I tell the prosecutor, "This is a defensible case, and we will go to court, and we will try the case," sometimes they think twice about bringing the case if I can persuade them that there are doubts. Remember, prosecutors have a tremendous burden in this country. They have to prove their case beyond a reasonable doubt, and that's a tough standard. So, I have credibility. When I tell them, "This is a case that's going to be a tough one for you," sometimes they listen.
