Former federal prosecutors, as I am, tend to be better on paper. They're better particularly in white collar cases where there are lots of documents. We're used to dealing with voluminous documents and multi-witnesses and grand jury transcripts, and most importantly the ability to present your client's case in written format in both state and federal court. That's an advantage.

The feds do it a little bit more prolifically, so you have some experience in doing that. That's where the federal experience comes into play.
